

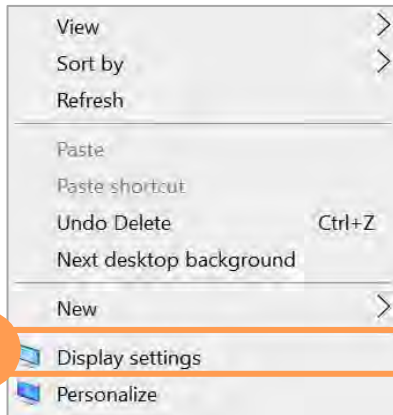
Multiple Monitors not working? Check this out!

Windows 10 provides support for multiple displays (monitors). Monitors can be connected to any video port on your computer. However, it is sometimes confusing to determine which monitor should be connected to which video port. Windows will work with all connected monitors, but the monitors must be arranged within Windows in order for the mouse and applications to work as expected.

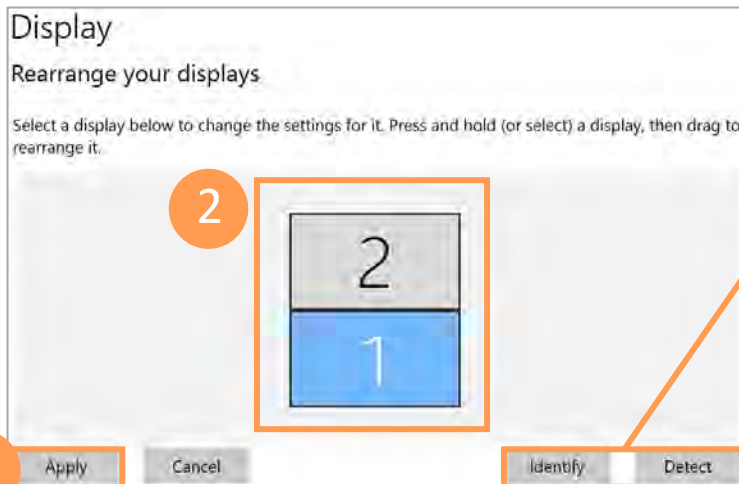
Rearranging monitors on Windows 10

To rearrange monitors on Windows 10, follow these steps:

1. Right-click anywhere on your desktop and select **Display Settings**.



2. Under the **Select and rearrange displays** section, drag and drop each display to rearrange the displays according to their physical layout on your desk.



- If you're unsure which monitor you're selecting, click the **Identify** button to figure it out.
- If a monitor isn't showing up, make sure it is receiving power and connected correctly, and then click the **Detect** button.
- If you are still having problems, reset their connections (or restart the computer), and try the Detect button again.

Note: When rearranging monitors in the "Display" settings page, make sure that all monitors align at the top perfectly. Otherwise, you'll have problems moving the mouse cursor between monitors from the corners.

3. Click **Apply** to save your changes.

Once you complete the steps, Windows 10 will save the physical layout, and you'll be able to work across each display and run applications without issues.
